If you have an agricultural dispute, the Michigan Agricultural Mediation Program (MAMP) is here to help you. Since 1987, this free program has helped farmers reach fast, confidential solutions without the need for litigation.

What is mediation?

Mediation is a voluntary process in which a neutral third party (the mediator) helps facilitate productive discussions between parties. The mediator ensures everyone has an opportunity to be heard and works toward a mutually acceptable resolution.

What issues can I use mediation for?

Mediation is available when issues arise between producers and creditors. It is also available for disputes between producers and USDA agencies over agricultural loans; agricultural credit; wetland determinations; compliance with farm programs, including conservation programs; crop insurance; pesticides; rural development loans; and other agriculture-related topics.

How much does this cost?

Mediation through MAMP is provided at no cost to participants.
